William Burden Gellatly, a 26 old French Cleaner from Perth, Scotland, enlisted into the 96th Company Imperial Yeomanry as a Private on 4 March 1901. Noting previous service with the 1st VB Queens Royal West Surrey Regiment, he was appointed Lance Sergeant on 4 September 1901. Serving in South Africa between 12 April 1901 and 30 August 1902, he was discharged from service on 7 September 1902. The QSA medal with 5 Clasps was his only medal entitlement

The 96th (Metropolitan Mounted Rifles) Company Imperial Yeomanry was raised in 1901 Company and formed part of the 24th battalion Imperial Yeomanry
