James Webb was a from Widnes near Warrington, he joined the 1<sup>st</sup> King's Royal Rifle Corps in July 1879 and served in South Africa from 1881-82. Having transferred to the 3<sup>rd</sup> Battalion in March 1881, he served in Egypt, 1882-84, Cyprus 1884-85 and Egypt in 1885, Webb was discharged in 1891.

Service papers note under '*Injuries in service*'; '*right arm and his third rib fractured on 23 March 1883*'. It is unclear if this was an injury or wounds.
